Just as salmon swim upstream, geese fly south, and swallows return to Capistrano, so you and I feel at certain times and seasons a strong compulsion to return to where we belong. An inner instinct tells us that we should get in touch with the origins of our being and re-establish ties to those things we consider most important.

North Presbyterian Church is our home. It's an important, loving family beyond our first family circle. How sweet it is to worship at our church and gather in fellowship to celebrate the goodness of God in song and praise. Here at North Presbyterian we find the tie that binds human hearts, the sense of being among people who care about us.

It's homecoming time this month at our church. After all the vacations and separations of the summer, we start a new church year of program and activity. On the second Sunday of September (September 8), worship services in our beautiful sanctuary begin as usual at 9:30 a.m.... but it's Rally Day! -- and that day marks the beginning of many new activities and events!

The coming months promise renewed activity in our church with regular meetings of youth, our traditional Rummage Sale on the 26th of October, and special Bible studies during the week. Returning to the chancel on Sundays is our wonderful choir, led by Paul Holland. In addition, I will begin a new sermon series during worship entitled "Into the Old," dealing with remarkable people of the Old Testament whose lives have special meaning for our times.

Let us follow the instinct and impulse of our hearts and return to the fellowship of the church and the worship of our God.


FALL Happenings




Approximately 40 people joined in on a beautiful sunny day!

In the Spotlight



NPC's Keyser Library

The Lynn G. Keyser Library has served as a resource and refuge at North Presbyterian Church for more than two decades.

Books, DVDs and audiotapes in the library cover a range of topics – the Bible, Christian life, inspiration, theology, family issues, death and dying, history and biography, to name a few. There is an extensive fiction section, a spot for youth and children's material, devotionals, Bible study booklets and DVDs. Extra copies of books already in the collection are offered free to anyone who wants to take them.

The library also serves as an easily accessible, and comfortable, spot for meetings, Bible studies, quiet conversation or individual meditation.

In the early 1990s, according to our annual reports, library materials were used extensively. Volunteers – including Sylvia Tuller, Wendy Swatling, Anne Beattie, Marge Schornstheimer and Mary Ruth Ostrander – kept track of checked-out materials, cataloged donated books, supervised Elmira College students who computerized the inventory, and even created a “book nook” at St. Cecelia's Church when the congregation was meeting at that site following the fire in 1999.

Unfortunately, now very few people seem to use the wonderful resources available in the Keyser Library. It's easy to check out materials, using the “old-school” method! Just sign the card in the back of the book and leave it in the box on the counter next to the door. Return the item when you are done; there are no late fees, fines or letters reminding you that you've had something much too long.

The Session of North Presbyterian Church has called a Congregational Meeting to be held on Sunday, September 8, 2019 immediately following worship (approximately 10:30 a.m.) for the purpose of conferring (voting on) Pastor Emeritus Status for the Rev. Dr. Robert Edmunds.

From the Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery of Geneva regarding Pastor Emeritus Status:

The session shall make a formal written request to the COM with accompanying rationale for conferring this honor on a former pastor. Session representatives may be asked to attend a Committee on Ministry meeting to interpret the request. (See below).

Following COM's approval, the congregation at a duly called congregational meeting may elect the retired pastor or associate pastor emeritus or emerita. It is important to carefully interpret that the title is honorary with no inherent pastoral duties or authority and no compensation.

The action of the congregation requires approval by the Presbytery of Geneva.

Following all of necessary approvals, it is appropriate to arrange for a worship service to celebrate the election of this honorary relationship.

Session submitted the following recommendation to the Committee on Ministry which was approved on August 7, 2019:

The Reverend Robert Edmunds (retired fall 2015 First United Presbyterian Church of Dale City, Woodbridge, Va.). His tenure at North Presbyterian Church in Elmira NY spanned from 1983 to 1999. In that time, he grew in the congregation's hearts, a love and a longing to know God. He led pivotal training programs of Kerigma and Stephen Ministries. He brought on associate pastors Scott Miller and Debbie Dill and started youth programs that grew to annual summer mission experiences, broadening mission involvement to intergenerational experiences internationally! Dr. Edmunds encouraged the music program, hiring dynamic directors and talented musicians. He generously shared and intertwined his life to ours by having events at his house, his daughter's involvement with the programs with his wife Susan, also making sure we were all welcomed with programs and events. Daughters Emily and Hannah were shared with all of us as we too shared our children with each other, in the true example of a caring community. Shining Jesus love. We learned that through Bob's love and gentleness.

These are just a few examples of the many ways Dr. Edmunds built in his congregation a foundational strength and resilience that has served North Church, its people and community, beyond what anyone might have imagined. Because of Dr. Edmund's leadership, the members of North Presbyterian Church were prepared for the trials we have been through, from fire to rebuilding, from schism to mutual respect, from tumultuous times to the best of times.



**Session Summary
August 19, 2019**

NPC BUSINESS

Rev. Hicks called the meeting to order and determined that a quorum was present. The meeting was convened in Scripture and prayer led by Barb Duryea.

Joel Robinson reviewed the Ministry Information Form (M.I.F.) prepared by the Pastor Nominating Committee. Session approved the M.I.F. for submission to the Committee on Ministry.

Minutes of the May June 17, 2019 stated Session meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

The Financial Secretary reviewed the Financial Statements including the Profit and Loss Budget Performance for July 2019 and the Account Activity Summary for the Endowment Fund. Pledge income year-to-date is \$8,319 lower than the year-to-date budget amount. Session received the report (with thanks) including monthly and year-to-date financial statements as presented.

The Financial Secretary reviewed the 2020 budget forms that were provided for the Chairman of each committee. 2020 budget requests need to be returned to the Financial Secretary by November 1, 2019 in order for the Budget to be prepared for review by the Session at the November 18, 2019 stated Session meeting.

The Financial Secretary will be out of the office for three weeks beginning October 1, 2019. While she is away, Joel Robinson and Janice Williams will be handling day-to-day financial responsibilities for NPC (writing checks, making deposits).

Motion authorizing Kim Townson (Church Administrator) as second signatory on NPC checks was made by Ann Motley, seconded by Annie LeFevre. Motion carried.

The Meyer Scholarship Committee was discussed. Ann Motley and Bill Furnas agreed to research the by-laws/job description for the committee. A proposal regarding the oversight and membership of the committee will be brought back to Session.

Rev. Hicks provided Session with a written report. He reviewed a tentative Church Activity Schedule ("CAS") for September 2019 through January 2020. He noted that a Session approved CAS should eliminate potential scheduling conflicts for important events in the life of the church. Session approved the document as amended.

Jeff Richards provided the Session with an update on Presbytery news. Susan Orr is the new Presbytery Leader. She is half-time with the Presbytery of Geneva and half-time with the Presbytery of Genesee Valley.

Session approved a request from the Buildings and Grounds committee to have the shrubbery around the property trimmed and to clear a gap between the parking lot fence and the bushes at an approximate cost of \$350.

Session approved a request from the Buildings and Grounds and Communication committees to update the phone system, including 2 new extensions with cordless phones for the Finance Office and the Christian Education Office on the second floor at a cost of \$3,295.

Session approved and updated Worship and Event Cancellation procedure as presented by the Communications committee.

Session adopted a Communication with Church Office Form as presented by the Communication committee.

Session approved the Deep Blue Kids Sunday School Curriculum as recommended by the Education committee.

Session approved a recommendation from the Mission and Outreach Committee to assign 25% of the Peace and Global Witness Offering to the Cohocton Church for the rebuilding of their 150-year-old pipe organ.

Session approved a change in communion for Sunday, September 1, 2019. Communion will be served by Intinction rather than in the pews.

Session called a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, September 8, 2019 immediately following worship for the purpose of conferring Pastor Emeritus status to Rev. Dr. Robert Edmunds (approved by C.O.M. 8/7/2019).

The meeting adjourned in prayer at 9:55 p.m.
