**A Letter from Pastor Hansen**

Recently, someone asked me how the Scripture readings for each Sunday are selected. As I approach my one (1) year anniversary of arriving at North Pres, I thought I might take the opportunity to explain how the Scripture readings and hymns are selected for each worship service.

On August 9, 2020, when I preached my first sermon as your installed pastor, I started the sermon with a couple sentences on how I planned preach from the Revised Common Lectionary (“the lectionary”). Since that first sermon, I have stuck with my initial decision to use the lectionary to plan each week’s worship service. There are certainly weeks in which I am not overly enthusiastic with the passages sitting on the page and staring back at me, ***but this is why I use the lectionary.*** Even though the lectionary covers only about ten (10) percent or so of the Bible over its three-year cycle, it takes on its fair share of difficult texts. Sitting with and praying through difficult Scripture passages is a form of spiritual discipline.

As a spiritual discipline, it requires me to listen to the Holy Spirit week-in and week-out to prayerfully try to discern where the Spirit is leading us in worship. This is not to say that the pastors who do not preach from the lectionary are not listening to the Spirit – they are. However, for me, preaching from the lectionary is a practice that I have adopted to help me be a better pastor and a better preacher. At the same time, our tradition gives me the freedom to change my mind and decide to preach a sermon series on a particular biblical theme, such as Sabbath, or on the Ten Commandments, or even preach through a particular book in the Bible.

Just as the person preaching has the freedom to choose which passages from Scripture they will preach on, they also have freedom and responsibility to select the music to be sung by the congregation for each worship service. W-2.0304. In reality, I do not actually pick every piece of music we sing each Sunday. Instead, I work with our music director, Paul Holland, to choose the music. However, if there are issues, the proverbial “buck” always stops with me. How choir anthems, bell choir pieces, and other musical offerings are selected is handled differently. W-2.0305. Here, my role shifts from having the freedom to select the music to conferring with our very capable and talented musical director, Paul Holland.

Even though I will have been here for a year on August 3, 2021, we only started singing a few weeks ago. This means I have not yet learned which hymns you like to sing and are familiar with. As much as I would like to select music that somehow relates to the Scripture readings or the theme of the sermon, it is also important to me that we are making a joyful noise to the Lord. Ps. 100:1. If there are hymns that you like to sing, please tell me. This does not mean that Paul Holland and I will not try to introduce new praise songs and hymns or that we will always select music that everyone likes. At the same time, the more feedback I get on what works well and what does not work well, the better able I am to plan worship and to work with our talented musicians to select music that is meaningful and enjoyable to sing.

# Did You Know?



- Per NYS mandatory COVID-19 guidelines, all persons aged 2 years and up who are not yet fully vaccinated must wear masks and maintain social distancing.
- Session has decided that those who have been vaccinated will not be required to wear a mask while sitting, standing or singing.
- We will continue our contact tracing measures, for the time being.
- We will continue our Maître'D style seating, for the time being.
- As long as there are fewer than 250 people in the building, we are authorized to use, and will use, the honor system in regards to vaccine status. We trust that persons will wear masks if they are not fully vaccinated.
- We will continue to use bulletin inserts for the music, for the time being. We hope to return to hymnals soon.
- The lyrics for the praise songs and hymns will continue to be sent with the Zoom link even after we return to using hymnals.

## Sanctuary Worship:

In order to comply with the CDC/NYS guidelines, the Session of NPC has decided on the following:

- Seating during worship will remain socially distanced.
- **Worshippers who are NOT vaccinated are still required to wear a mask.**
- **Vaccinated worshipers are not required to wear masks while sitting, standing or singing.**
- Churches with fewer than 250 persons in worship may rely on the honor system for reporting vaccination status.
- **Congregants will still need to register at the Welcome Center.**
- **We will no longer be using the Maître D' for seating.**
- Friendship pads and hymnals have been removed from the pews to minimize contact transmission.
- The service will always appear on the large screen at the front of the church.





This month is intern month. We are introducing to you our two lovely interns, Christina Brock and Jefferey Koehl. Both on fire for the Lord and have come a long way since both going through our program 6/7 months ago. They have both decided to stay and give back to the ministry that gave them a second chance.

"I came to this program depressed and exhausted from years of trying to earn Gods love and favor. It had gotten to the point where I couldn't even function normally, because I believed, deep down, that I had let God down, and that He had let me down. That's nonsense; I was never holding God up, and He never stopped holding me up. But that was what I believed, and it nearly destroyed me. Except that it didn't, because God snatched me out of that darkness and brought me to Renovation House, where I encountered Him and His love on a whole new level. He showed me that He was not surprised or disappointed in my failures and they certainly didn't affect His love for me. I have been His child since I was three years old, and nothing I've done or not done since then has made Him look at me any differently. He doesn't want me to strive to earn anything for Him; He just wants me to rest in His love, and learn to love Him back. And when I fail in any way, however large or small, He doesn't want me to sit under the weight of that; He wants me to give Him my failures, and let Him use them to bring Him even more glory and me even more joy, than if it had never happened. Now I walk victoriously, side by side with my beloved Lord, following His lead step by step, and learning to love Him more and more each day." – Christina



"My name is Jefferey Koehl and I am 19 years old. A year and a half ago I was in a mental hospital, depressed, suicidal, and lacking any amount of hope. But at the Renovation House I found the joy of the Lord, the peace that God brings, and the perfect will and purpose that the Lord has for my life. I completed and graduated the Renovation House program and decided to stay on indefinitely as an intern. I am grateful for the training and discipleship that I am receiving here which is raising me up to be a future minister of the Gospel. Part of my training is earning a degree in Christian Ministry through Chesapeake Bible College. I have also had the blessing to participate in traveling to a few different states exploring the future of the Renovation House. A year and a half ago I would have never thought I would or could be doing any of these things but God is so good. Lastly I have learned to not let my youth and past define me. Because youth does not define what God is calling me to do. Thank you so much for pouring into this program that transformed my life and so many others."

A Stewardship Message from the Finance Committee:

Ask God to show us where we need to work and grow - how we can build the vitality of our congregation and achieve the seven markers outlined above. ## Session Summary

6:00 p.m. Sunday, June 20, 2021

The Clerk determined that a quorum was present.

Rev. Hansen called the meeting to order and the meeting was opened with devotions and prayer led by Wendy Swatling.

The Moderator led a discussion on Chapters 5 & 6 of “Spiritual Leadership”.

The minutes of the May 16, 2021 stated Session meeting, and the May 22, 2021 special Session meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

Session approved the requests for transfer of membership from Alice Kain (former Lake Street Presbyterian Church) and Kathryn and Eliana Hansen (Nassau Presbyterian Church, Princeton, NJ).

The Treasurer reviewed the Financial Statements including the Profit and Loss Budget Performance for April and the Account Activity Summary for the Endowment Fund. She noted that Pledge Income is on track and the Endowment Fund is healthy. A withdrawal of \$30,000 was made from the Endowment Fund in May to pay bills. \$618.16 was received for the Pentecost offering, 40% of which stays local to fund programs for at-risk youth. The Treasurer’s report was received, with thanks, by the Session.

Year-to-date budgets for each committee were reviewed.

Rev. Hansen reported that he and George Batrowny had a wonderful, in-person visit with Hal and Donna Wolfe. He participated in the Ordination and Installation service at Covington Presbyterian Church on Sunday, June 20<sup>th</sup>. He is chairing the Presbytery of Geneva search committee for a new Presbytery Leader. Rev. Hansen reported that the Youth Protection Policy committee has been meeting every two weeks and he is hopeful that the policy will be submitted to various committees for their review by the end of summer. Over the past month he has enjoyed the increase in drop-in visitors during his open office hours.

Annie LeFevre reported that the May 25, 2021 Presbytery meeting had a camping theme, which included small group break-out sessions. She appreciates the effort that goes into making the meetings and worship experience meaningful. The Sexual Misconduct Policy is being updated

On the recommendation of the Staff Relations and Worship and Music committees, Session approved the amended Organist job description.

On the recommendation of the Worship and Music committee, Session approved moving the location and time of worship for Sunday, August 15, 2021. Worship will be held under the Grove Park pavilion at 10:30 a.m. A picnic lunch will immediately follow worship.

On the recommendation of the Worship and Music committee, Session approved acceptance of a gift from the former Lake Street Presbyterian Church (Bible marker and table runner).

On the recommendation of the Deacons, Session authorized Ruling Elders who have received training from Rev. Hansen to perform the liturgy of communion for homebound members.

Session approved a recommendation from the Buildings and Grounds committee to accept a quote of \$19,845.00 from Evans Roofing for the repair of the roof over the Sunday school classrooms.

Session approved a request of a non-member to use the Sanctuary on August 5, 2021 for a funeral.

Jeff Richards reported that the fellowship dinner held on June 2<sup>nd</sup> was very successful with 42 people in attendance and 10 carryout dinners provided.

Session unanimously approved a change in COVID-19 restrictions/procedures. Beginning June 27, 2021, fully vaccinated people will no longer be required to wear a mask whether sitting, standing, or singing. The Maître D system will be discontinued. Every-other pew will be roped-off and people will seat themselves. A record of those in attendance will be kept for contact tracing purposes. Clients of the Food Pantry will be required to wear masks and volunteers will be required to wear masks when serving clients.

The meeting adjourned in prayer at 8:50 p.m.
