A Letter from Pastor Hansen

Dear Friends,

The cast is off and the wrist splint is back on. I will be meeting with my doctor in the upcoming weeks to discuss what steps, if any, lie ahead. In the meantime, I am trying to refrain from typing and to continue using dictation to write my sermons, my emails, this newsletter article, and an upcoming Bible study curriculum that I am working on for this fall.

This fall the Adult Sunday School class will be studying the Old Testament Book of Micah. The class will explore themes commonly found throughout the Old Testament prophets as well as look at different ways to read and study scripture. I am excited to lead this class for a couple reasons. First, Micah's words continue to speak to us in our time and place. Second, I enjoy spending time studying scripture with all of you.

I hope to have the materials for at least the first four sessions ready by Sunday, September 11, which is the first Sunday of Sunday School. 



Please welcome our new Pianist, Randy Cornell



GIVING UPDATE

This is a mid-year update on the finances of the presbytery. The expense budget is \$676,549.64, which includes Camp Whitman. As of the end of June \$348,233.32 had been received; 50% of this was for Camp Whitman.

During same time period \$301,105 has been spent. 40% of this has been for the camp. While the Presbytery currently has adequate reserves, it is important for churches to provide continued support as we work together to support and equip congregations and leaders to be Christ in the Finger Lakes and the world.

Our congregation retains 25% of the donations to further the efforts of Christ's peace locally. 50% of the total funds collected go to the Presbyterian Mission Agency (the "PMA") to "advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness." The PMA gives the other 25% to mid-councils to be utilized in ministries of peace and reconciliation. The 2022 collection begins September 4th and concludes with World Communion Sunday, October 2nd. "The Peace and Global Witness Offering encourages the church to cast off anxiety and fear, discord and division, and embrace our God's mission of reconciliation to those around the corner and around the world. A gift to the Peace and Global Witness Offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world." NPC Board of Session

Summary of Session Meeting held at North Presbyterian Church on Sunday, August 21, 2022 at 6:00 P.M. in the Brisbane Room.

Elders present: Steven Allison, Timothy Allison, George Batrowny, Barbara Duryea, Susan Hoskins, Eva “Annie” LeFevre, James Mosher, Wendy Swatling, Linda Palmer

Treasurer: Patricia Richards

A quorum was determined; the meeting opened with prayer and was called to order by the Moderator. Mrs. Palmer was elected Clerk Pro tempore.

The minutes of the June 19, 2022 Session Meeting were approved. Mrs. Palmer presented the Clerk’s Report noting the statistics for the months of June and July. Mrs. Richards presented the Treasurer’s Report. Donations from two groups that held events at North Church were used towards the purchase of two new refrigerators.

Details were finalized for the Pastor Emeritus Celebration to be held August 27th and 28th honoring Dr. Robert Edmunds and Mrs. Susan Edmunds.

Pastor Hansen presented his report noting the busy summer attending General Assembly activities in Louisville and via Zoom, Vacation Bible School, and visiting “homebound” members.

The Geneva Presbytery held a special meeting to examine Susan Rack, welcome her to the Geneva Presbytery, and approve her call and install her as the Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Ulysses. The ordination exam readers for the fall of 2022 were also elected.

Oral Committee Reports given (in addition to written reports received):

Buildings and Grounds – Balland Fencing will install roughly 209’ of chain link fence straight from the garden behind the church to Irvine Place at a cost not to exceed \$5,000.

The garage roof continues to leak, the Manse kitchen porch roof directs water into the space between the house and the porch and not into the gutters, and the Manse front porch roof shingles are blowing off and there no gutters, so the water pouring directly into the basement. Hale Roofing has inspected the property and offers to overlay the garage roof and the front porch roof, install gutters on the front porch roof, and place EDM on the flat kitchen roof that will direct the water to the gutters. The final quote for the work is expected in the coming days. \$10,000 was budgeted for the garage repairs. The Buildings and Grounds Committee was authorized to enter into an agreement with Hale Roofing for the aforementioned roofing improvements utilizing the \$10,000 budgeted for 2022 repairs. Session will ratify the cost for any additional funds, if necessary, at its next meeting.

NPC Board of Session

Worship and Music – Session approved participation in an Ecumenical Service on World Communion Sunday, October 2nd. This year the service will be held at New Beginnings United Methodist Church at 10 a.m. The United Baptist Church, Park Church, Grace Episcopal Church, and Bethany Lutheran Church are participating along with North and the UMC. The service will be available on Zoom. North’s congregants will be informed (email, bulletins, signs) of the change in worship location for that Sunday.

Session authorized the Treasurer and the Church Administrator to undertake the preservation of and disposition of certain records belonging to North Church with a report to Session of all actions undertaken with the focus of this project to be preserving images or recordings of prior Pastors and members for historical purposes with the preservation or disposition of financial documents made in compliance with all relevant retention schedules.

Staff Relations – Glory be to God and the power of prayer, a pianist has been found! Session authorized an agreement with Randy Cornell for the provision of services as a pianist and to accompany the choir. Welcome Mr. Cornell!

Education – Rally Day is September 11th. Bible studies will begin after Labor Day (Wednesday Noon on the 7th, Men evening of the 8th [Revelation], Women evening of the 13th [“Me, Myself, and Lies” by Jennifer Rothschild], Sunday Adults on the 11th [Micah]). The Committee is seeking new angel costumes.

Nominating – Seeking new members for the Buildings and Grounds Committee.

Congregational Life – Deacons – Communications were received from Rita Dery, now residing in Florida, and Karen Moshier. Mrs. Moshier included a donation in appreciation for a bereavement reception. The donation was accepted with gratitude by Session in Kevin Moshier’s memory, and an acknowledgement has been sent to Mrs. Moshier thanking her for the gift.

Fellowship – the monthly Wednesday night dinner and Saturday breakfast will commence in October.

Mission – the Pastor will present a “thank you” from the Mission Committee to the congregation.

The meeting adjourned with prayer at 7:35 p.m.
