#### April, 2023 A Letter from Pastor Hansen

I was recently a guest on a podcast hosted by the pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Seneca Falls, the Rev. Leah Ntuala, called "Clergy in Collars, Getting Coffee." Among other things, we talked about my favorite question in the Book of Order. As part of every ordination, installation, or commissioning, we ask the person or people standing before us "Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?" We did not have the Book of Order open in front of us and we talked as if creativity was also listed in the question – which it is not. We do not, explicitly at least, ask people to serve with creativity. And yet, I would argue that creativity is implied in that question, because when we act with energy, intelligence, imagination, *and* love, it requires creativity.

We often refer to people who are artistically talented as being creative – and they are. However, creativity is far broader than that. Creativity is what allows us to discern that a conversation is not going well and instead of doubling down or walking away, we take the chance of imagining how the other person might be feeling or what they might be going through and we try to put ourselves in their shoes. It takes creativity to shift how we think and to change how we communicate with someone. This is not easy. It requires effort and practice. It requires us to step back and reflect. It requires us to use our imagination. And it requires us to act with love. When we do all these things, we engage with the world around us differently than before and we are changed for the better.

Regardless of whether we are ordained as a minister, a ruling elder, a deacon, or not ordained at all, we are all called to serve with "energy, intelligence, imagination, and love." We are all called to serve with creativity. This means that we have to be willing to change and to adapt. What worked yesterday, may not today, and what works today, may not work tomorrow. This is how life works. Seasons change. Weather changes. Winds shift. Within these cycles there are constant shifts and movements that make each day different from the last. This is no accident. God created a universe which is constantly moving and changing – and we cannot stop that.

We are called to ask: where is the Holy Spirit calling us to think and act creatively? Where is Christ Jesus leading us to act with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love? We are all asked these questions each and every day. Sometimes we will get it wrong (and really wrong at that); and sometimes we will get it right. However, the more we ask, the more often we carefully discern where God is calling us to act with creativity, love, mercy, and grace, the more often we will get it right.

In these coming days, weeks, months, and years, let us trust our God and lean in to God's grace with all we have, because God's grace is the grace that gives us the freedom to answer "will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love" with creativity and hope, knowing that yesterday's answer may not be today's and today's answer may not be tomorrow's. And that, my friends, is a good thing.

Children and Youth Ministry April 2023



As we enter this last week before Easter, may the Holy Spirit guide you and may you find peace and joy as we rejoice in our risen Lord!






### COVID RULES FOR NORTH PRES

- Thank you all for your patience and understanding. We're all in this together!







Session Summary March 19, 2023 Quarterly Dinner meeting

The Clerk determined that a quorum was present.

Rev. Hansen called the meeting to order, and the meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Hansen.

The minutes of the February 19, 2023 Session meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

The Treasurer reviewed the Financial Statements including the Profit and Loss Budget Performance for February 2023, noting that income is slightly under budget, which is not unusual for this time of year. \$30,000 was transferred from the Endowment Fund to pay bills in February. The Treasurer's report was received, with thanks, by the Session.

Following dinner, a discussion was held regarding the final chapters of "God, Improv and the Art of Living".

The meeting adjourned in prayer at 7:30 p.m.
