August, 2023 A Letter from Pastor Hansen

At some point in the early afternoon of Sunday, August 6, I will pack up the car and leave for a week to serve as a volunteer chaplain at Camp Whitman. The theme this year at Camp Whitman is "Sabbath."

We often associate the idea of Sabbath with not working. Deuteronomy 5:15 records that the rationale given by the Lord for the Sabbath command was the deliverance of Israel from bondage in Egypt. Sabbath was and is a redemption from the activities that occupy our thoughts and our actions, including work.

But Sabbath goes beyond that. As the theologian Karl Barth observed, Sabbath is a gift of grace – not given to humankind or creation as a reward for a job well-done but given to us before we had even lifted a finger. We were created to enjoy the grace and freedom of Sabbath. (CD III/1, 98).

But to enjoy Sabbath and the freedom found in God's grace, we have to change what we mean by "freedom." Biblically, freedom is not the ability to do as we please. Freedom is the ability to limit our activities and to stop. (CD III/1, 215). If we cannot limit our activities or the demands we place upon ourselves, we are not free in any sense of the word. Rather, what we do and what is expected of us defines us and we are no longer free to be who God created us to be.

There are many, many things in our lives that demand our attention and our time. We live in a culture that defines us and our value by what we do and by how productive we are. We fill our time with activities such as work, housework, chores like laundry and dishes, cleaning, etc. We fill our time with screens, whether it is a TV screen, a computer monitor, a phone, or a tablet. And I say all these things as someone who is by no means immune to this filling of my time with activities or screens. In a world obsessed with productivity and busyness, Sabbath can become a problem that needs to be solved.

But Sabbath is not a problem to be solved. It is not an activity to take on. It is not a burden to take upon ourselves. It is not a burden to place on others. Sabbath is instead a protest. It is a radical protest against the idea that we are what we produce, we are what we do, and we are what we consume. Sabbath declares that we are not defined by our work, our activities, how many followers or friends we have on social media platforms, how many likes we get for a post, how neat our lawns are, how perfect our gardens are, how clean and tidy our homes are, how nice our clothes and things are, or how successful our kids are.

As the Rabbi Abraham Heschel observed throughout his book, *The Sabbath*, Sabbath is God's gift of time, a reservation of time in which the woes and worries of the world are lifted from our shoulders and given over to God. It is a moment in time in which we can truly be alive and be present in the moment. And Sabbath does not have to be on a Sunday (or a Saturday). Sabbath is any day in which we set aside our worries, our woes, the demands placed upon us, and we accept the gift of time given to us by our God, a gift of grace, a gift to rest. A gift we desperately need.
