November, 2023 A Letter from Pastor Hansen

Thank you. Thank you for the cards. Thank you for the scarf. Thank you for being who you are. Each October, I am reminded that it is "Pastor Appreciation Month." Each time it comes around, it also gives me an opportunity to express how thankful I am to be your pastor. You are a wonderful congregation. You really are.

You are a faithful congregation. Every Wednesday and every Friday, our parking lot is a testament to how committed you are to caring for others in our community. Our food pantry is a lifeline to people in need. Without your faithfulness and your commitment to this ministry, people would have a much harder time getting the food they need.

You are a caring congregation. Even before we arrived in Elmira, our family felt cared for. You invested in your manse to update it and make it a wonderful home for us. Whether it was adding fencing and landscaping, making it possible for us to have two large raised beds for gardening, or allowing us to plant plants and trees that we like, you, as a congregation, have done a very good job caring for us.

You are a worshipful congregation. My goodness, you have a deep love for music. You have a wonderful music ministry. Playing the bells, singing in the choir, children singing, getting up and singing praise songs with Paul, or singing solos are all part of our ministry. Participating in worship is an act of ministry. As Christ told his disciples, wherever two or three are gathered, Christ is among us. When we gather, whether it is over Zoom, in parking lots, or in-person, Christ is present.

You are a generous congregation. You give of your time, you give of your resources, you give of your skills. You do this when you donate turkeys for our harvest dinner. You do this when you volunteer in and outside of our church. You all give of yourselves in so many ways.

You are a welcoming congregation. I can go on about how you welcomed our family when we arrived. You are a congregation in which I see people who are generally excited to see one another. You give grace to one another. You make our neighbors feel welcome in a world with few welcoming places.

Does this happen all the time? No. Are there bumps, bruises, and moments of what can only be called "moments of not so shining glory?" Yes. But as the Apostle Paul's letters remind us, to be in a faith community is to be in a community of humans. Any time humans come together, we do not get everything right or treat everyone as we should. But that does not take away from how wonderful you can be and often are. Living out our faith is not about perfection; it's about loving people who are far from perfect — and we are all far from perfect.

You are a wonderful congregation. You really are. Thank you for letting my family and me be part of your ministry these past three years and for years to come.

Children and Youth Ministry November 2023







On Oct. 7, 2023, Israel suffered its deadliest attack in decades. Hamas-armed militants breached many security sites and launched a barrage of rockets to Israel. More than 1,300 people were killed, at least 3,000 people have been injured and 200 people were taken as hostages. In response, the Israeli government declared both a "state of emergency" and a "state of war," which has initiated a series of airstrikes on the densely populated Gaza Strip. This offensive has led to the tragic loss of thousands of Palestinian lives, over 50% of them women and children, and over 6,000 injured. The ongoing response from Israel has created a dire humanitarian crisis, with homes, schools, medical facilities and critical infrastructure extensively damaged or destroyed. Access to water and power is a major concern. The impact of this conflict has forced approximately 1 million of Gaza's 2.2 million residents to flee their homes, either out of fear for their lives or due to the ongoing bombardments.

The situation is dreadful. Civilians, including women, children and the elderly, are trapped in a war zone, facing a severe humanitarian crisis. They are enduring unimaginable hardships, and the need for immediate humanitarian relief is paramount. We cannot stand by and watch their plight without taking action. Our partners and other humanitarian organizations are imploring a cease-fire so that medical assistance and humanitarian corridors may be provided for those ordered to leave their homes or forced to flee. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) joins these voices as we pray for peace and safe passage for those seeking help and fleeing the ongoing chaos. Through PDA, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is providing assistance to those most vulnerable and supporting partners in Palestine and Israel who are responding to the needs of neighbors and strangers in their midst, no matter their religious beliefs, political views or nationality. We are called to care for all of God's children, especially those in war-torn communities, by responding to the urgent needs of those directly affected by the current conflict.

The needs for the response will be great. God's people are called on to stand in the "GAP" — Give. Act. Pray

We come before you, seeking your mercy and compassion for those who have borne the heavy burdens of conflict. Be with them in their moments of despair, and grant them strength to endure and rebuild their lives.

Lord, we humbly ask for an end to the cycle of violence and destruction. Guide the leaders and governments toward peaceful resolutions, diplomacy and understanding. May your divine wisdom inspire them to seek alternatives to war and to prioritize the well-being of all people.

In times of darkness, help us remember that we are all your children, and that love and compassion can transcend the divisions and hate that lead to war. Grant us the strength to work tirelessly for a world where conflicts are resolved through dialogue, justice and respect for one another.

May we undergird our prayers with tangible resources to help.

May we reach deeply, give generously and welcome extravagantly.

May we lift our voices in a strong and unified advocacy.

May we all, even as we breathe in lament, breathe out mercy, hope and peace.

And let us walk the path of peace and compassion, as we repent our complicity in cultures of violence and renew our efforts toward justice and peace.

We offer this prayer with hope for a future where the horrors of war are but distant memories, and where peace, love and harmony prevail.

In Christ, our prince of peace, we pray. Amen.

NPC Board of Session

Session Summary October 8, 2023

The Clerk determined that a quorum was present.

Rev. Hansen called the meeting to order, and the meeting was opened with devotions and prayer led by Tim Allison.

The agenda was approved as amended.

The minutes of the September 17, 2023 meeting were reviewed and approved as corrected.

Session reviewed the Financial Statements including the Profit and Loss Budget Performance for September 2023 and the Account Activity Summary for the Endowment Fund. \$80,000 was transferred from the Endowment Fund to pay for the new roof. The Treasurer's report was received, with thanks, by the Session.

Pastor Hansen reported that over 30 people were in attendance, with many also participating via ZOOM, for the Presbytery meeting hosted by NPC on Tuesday, September 26th. He thanked Linda Palmer and Steve Allison for their help in facilitating the meeting. The meeting included a celebration of the ministry of Janice Fitzgerald upon her retirement.

The following actions were taken by The Session:

- As recommended by the Worship and Music Committee, One Christmas Eve service will be held at 9:30 a.m. (no evening services). The morning services will include communion, a pageant, and special music.
- Designation of \$25,000 bequest from the Dick Gawenus estate to be used toward the purchase of new boilers.
- Pre-K to 2nd grade classroom will be relocated to the Wee-Worship Room (to be moved January 13, 2024).
- 3rd to 5th grade classroom will be relocated to the Edmunds Room (to be moved January 6, 2023). The Edmunds Room will be painted prior to moving.
- Wednesday evening worship service rescheduled for November 15th following Fellowship Dinner.

NPC Board of Session
