April, 2024 A Letter from Pastor Hansen

When was the last time you allowed yourself to dream? When was the last time you sat down with someone or a group of people and got excited about what might come out of your discussion? When was the last time you let your imagination wander? When was the last time you gave yourself space from what ordinarily occupies your time to do this?

Imagination and dreaming are not always given their due. They are sometimes dismissed as childish or a waste of time. They can be seen as getting in the way of our productivity and our ability to check off the tasks of the day. And yet, without them, nothing gets done.

Planning requires imagination. Think about painting a room. A person may go to the paint store and see colors they think might go well in the room. They may pick out a few of the color sample cards to take to the room. They then have to envision what the room might look like with each potential color. They might then figure out how much paint they need to buy to paint the room. To do all of this, a person needs to be able to see the room differently than it currently is and envision what it could be. It also takes time and space.

It takes time and space because to imagine and to dream requires us to pay attention to the present and the present reality and then, taking all of that into account, to think of it differently. Going back to the paint analogy, to paint a room requires preparation and a knowledge of the surface to be painted. Different surfaces require different techniques and preparation. Painting over a surface already painted with latex paint can be fairly easy. Painting over a surface already painted with an oil-based paint can require much more extensive preparation. Painting over certain pre-existing colors can be more difficult than painting over other pre-existing colors.

We can, of course, save time by repeating what has already been. If a room's walls are white, we can save time by repainting the walls with the same color and type of paint. But what if the room could be different? What if we could use different colors to accent each other? We might still have white trim or white windowsills, but now the trim or the windowsill, instead of being lost in a sea of identical paint color, stand out in new ways.

There is a reason that whenever a Minister of the Word and Sacrament or a ruling elder or a deacon is ordained, the person being ordained is asked "will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?" To follow Christ requires us to use our imaginations and to dream. Imagination is a gift of the Spirit; and, not just for ministers, elders, or deacons. It is a gift given to all.

To do mission, to pray for someone, to love someone, to give of ourselves, to follow the lead of our Savior and the Holy Spirit, requires us to engage our imaginations and to dream. As followers of Christ, we need to give ourselves the grace to set aside space and time from the demands put upon us and the courage to imagine, to dream, to listen, to think, to believe, to trust in the faith given to us, and to take a risk. Because the cool thing about paint and grace is that if it does not turn out – you can start over again.

Children and Youth Ministry April 2024





Embodying Easter in a Waynesboro, Pennsylvania laundromat

The church's Holy Week laundry outreach makes 'everything fresh and new'

LOUISVILLE — While most pastors devote Holy Week to poring over commentaries, planning worship and washing feet, the Rev. Caroline Vickery also washes clothes.

At the local laundromat.

That's where she and a handful of members from the Presbyterian Church of Waynesboro, Pennsylvania regularly bring a ministry of laundry, presence and hope to people living on the community's margins.

Including - and especially during - Holy Week.

"People don't realize the little indignities that come with dealing with poverty," said Vickery. "It seems unfair as we enter the season when we're talking about how Jesus welcomed the outcasts and was a

friend of sinners that we wouldn't be out in the community helping to restore people to being seen as valuable and whole."

Vickery, who was called to serve the 52-member congregation in September 2021, said that the church's Outreach Committee had been looking for a community program that could be handled by a small congregation when committee member and deacon, Sarah Stains, discovered a laundry ministry on Instagram.

"What I like about this ministry is that it's not labor intensive," said Vickery, who worked as a community organizer before graduating from McCormick Theological Seminary. "It's something that's doable for a church of our size. And, because I happened to be living in an apartment with no laundry facilities at the time, I started to use the nearby laundromat to get clean clothes and bedding and had to relearn how expensive clean laundry could be."

And how important.

"We can go to a laundromat and give out quarters and bring coloring sheets and markers and give people a little bit of joy," she said. "When you do the laundry by yourself, it's a chore. Instead, there's a happy energy that makes the laundry sparkle when people start talking to each other."

After launching its new "Fresh Start: Loads of Love" initiative, the congregation later received a \$500 grant from the Presbytery of Carlisle's portion of the Peace & Global Witness Offering, which empowers congregations and individuals to become peacemakers in their communities and in the world.

Vickery said that not only did the presbytery's grant enable them to continue the church's laundry outreach, but it also helped the congregation to see the ministry in a new light — as something valuable.

"Every two months we provide quarters, snacks and connection," Vickery said. "We always go on the last

Monday of the month since people on public assistance are running low on money at the end of the month. We have had the opportunity to help a homeless family squatting in a house with no electricity or running water and help a woman with cancer have clean bedding. Through our ministry at the laundromat, we also made contact with a woman living in violence, whom I was eventually able to drive to safety."

Vickery said that as a Matthew 25 congregation, the church is growing in its understanding of what that means.

"We do know that Jesus makes it clear that how we treat the vulnerable is how we treat Jesus," she said.
"Because most of our members are college educated, literate and middle class, our laundry outreach has put them in touch with a world whose hardships they're unaware of. It comes as a shock for people to realize how costly doing your laundry can be, and to know that people can't use their SNAP benefits to buy detergent, cleaning supplies or personal hygiene items. Not being able to keep yourself clean robs people of their dignity. There's something very restorative about knowing that people will be able to be their best selves."

And isn't that the heart of the Easter message?

"Holy Week gives us a chance to show that Jesus makes all things new," said Vickery. "That's why we call it 'Fresh Start.' It's a chance to start over."

A note from NPC Board of Session

What do you think of when you hear the words North Church? The food pantry? Yes! It is an important part of our mission and ministry. How about our worship service? For me, it is music.

We have an amazing team that brings us together to worship the Lord! North Church is blessed to have Paul, Sharon, Randy and Suzie playing, teaching, leading and praising God through the adult and youth choirs, praise band, bells, and more. We are also blessed to have musicians join us over the years – vocalists, violinists, bassists, trumpeters, flutists! Music is a language of its own, and it is woven throughout the Bible. It is an integral part of our worship service!

On February 21st, Pastor Evan advised Session the organ needed some attention: the rubber cloth on a Pedal Schwimmer regulator was torn. The company (Parsons Pipe Organ Builders) that services the organ repaired it enough to hopefully get us through Lent, and they have since submitted a proposal to replace all four of these units that regulate the wind pressure to all the pipes (holes will disable the organ). The original Schwimmer wind regulators for the organ were constructed of rubber cloth – they are worn out after forty-four years of service! The new ones are constructed of thick pneumatic leather and are intended to last over sixty years!

At a special meeting on Sunday, March 24th, Session approved the proposal submitted by Parsons to replace the rubber cloth on the four Schwimmer wind regulators at a cost of \$19,216 for all the necessary labor, materials, and travel expenses (from Canandaigua). With only about \$8,000 budgeted for all instrument (organ, pianos, bells) maintenance and repair in 2024, from where should the expense be paid?

God is so good to us! One month prior to this unexpected expense, January 21st to be exact, Session accepted a bequest in the amount of \$92,660.78 from the Ethel A. Whitaker Charitable Remainder Trust! At that same meeting, Session authorized a ten percent tithe from those funds. The Mission and Outreach Committee is prayerfully considering their use.

As a church that is dependent upon its endowments to fund our ministry, I cannot stress what a blessing these unexpected bequests are to our endurance. If you would like information on remembering North Church in this manner, please talk to Joel Robinson or Kurt Kalweit, cochairs of the Finance Committee.

We are a generous congregation! If you are moved this year to help fund the organ repairs (or for any of our equipment – maybe the organ is not your thing), or any of our other "big ticket" future expenses (boiler, parking lot), just make a notation on your check or other giving vehicle, and those funds will be earmarked for that use in a special savings account.

Thank you for your trust in the leadership of North to make decisions that are right for our church. Please know that your input and opinions are needed and welcome. This is a family, a community of faith, and we need everyone working together as God designed. He speaks – listen for the Holy Spirit moving and working in YOU! You do not need to be a Pastor, or Elder, or even a lifetime member – we are all the same in the eyes of God. What freedom! Isn't that wonderful?!? Thanks be to God!

From the Finance Committee

The finance committee met with a representative from Chemung Canal to review the endowment fund invested with them. The representative covered the current investment strategy for the fund. He also shared returns for the fund over various periods from three months to ten years. Following discussion the committee agreed to keep the current investment strategy for the fund in place. The strategy being used spreads the funds over various equity and fixed income investments which limits principal risk.

From the Finance Committee

The new cash policy below was approved during the February Session meeting.

Along with the new policy is a cash deposit form.

Copies of this form can be found in the workroom.

NORTH PRESBYTERIAN CASH POLICY

This policy applies whenever cash is disbursed or received as part of an event, fundraiser, special assembly, etc. Cash collected during a worship service is covered under a separate policy.

Whenever cash is disbursed, both parties to the disbursement shall count the cash together, and both sign a receipt verifying the amount at the time of transfer. That receipt shall be generated by the disburser, and include the date and identification of the event.

EXAMPLE: When cash is distributed to Harvest Dinner delivery drivers to use to make change, the driver and the disbursing party shall count the funds together and both sign a receipt for the funds.

When cash is received into the church, two people shall immediately count the amount received, and both sign a receipt for that amount. The receipt shall be generated by the person who is receiving the money, and shall include the date and identification of the event.

EXAMPLE: When money is donated at a fellowship dinner, that money shall be collected and counted by two people, and the receipt generated by the fellowship chair or alternate.

Cash disbursed/received for separate events should not be comingled, even if the events are sponsored by the same committee.

The disbursement/return receipts, the Cash Deposit Form and the deposit shall be given to the treasurer immediately after the event. Under no circumstances shall cash be kept anywhere except the finance office until recorded in the financial records and deposited in the bank.

If the treasurer or designee is unavailable to place the items in the finance office safe, those iems should be placed in a signed, dated envelope and inserted into the finance office drop box; an email/text/call should then be made so the treasurer is aware of the drop.

Receipts shall be maintained in the financial records for a minimum of (1) year.





The Clerk determined that a quorum was present.

Rev. Hansen called the meeting to order, and the meeting was opened with devotions and prayer led by Rev. Hansen.

The minutes of the February 18, 2024 stated Session meeting were reviewed and approved as corrected.

Session reviewed the Financial Statements including the Profit and Loss Budget Performance for February 2024 and the Account Activity Summary for the Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fund continues to be strong, with a positive change in market value in February of more than \$56,000. The Treasurer's report was received, with thanks, by the Session.

The Clerk determined that a quorum was present.

Rev. Hansen called the meeting to order and opened the meeting with prayer.

Rev. Hansen explained that this Special Meeting was requested by two members of Session for the purpose of considering the proposed bid by Parsons Pipe & Organ Builders ("Parsons") for the repair or the organ (replacement of all 4 wind stabilizers) in the amount of \$19,216, which includes the necessary labor, materials, and travel expenses. The replacement parts are good for 30-40 years with the right upkeep and maintenance of the organ. The organ has been well maintained over the years, and this type of repair is not uncommon for an organ of this age. Parsons have inspected the organ, and no other potential issues were found. Rev. Hansen noted that the last financial report included \$8,844.99 in the endowment fund set aside for instrument repair.

Motion by Linda Palmer, seconded by Annie LeFevre, to accept the bid from Parsons for the repair of the organ and to utilize up to \$19,216 from the Whitaker bequest to pay the costs associated with the repair. Motion CARRIED.

Motion by Jim Mosher, seconded by Kurt Kalweit, authorizing Pastor Hansen and/or the Church Administrator to contact Parsons and request a proposal be sent to NPC for the signature of a designated Session member (Linda Palmer). Motion CARRIED.

Motion by Kurt Kalweit, seconded by Steven Allison, authorizing the Treasurer to pay Parsons the requested 10% deposit to secure scheduling of the repair. Motion CARRIED.

Linda Palmer volunteered to write an article for the April edition of The North Star to provide the congregation with an update on the organ and to encourage the congregation to financially support the repair and maintenance of the organ.
