

Have you ever heard the ‘proverb’ “God will not give you more than you can handle?” What if I told you that this ‘proverb’ is missing some really important context? The verse it is taken from, 1 Corinthians 10:13, states, in part: “No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your strength [...]”

Here is the missing context. In the Greek, “you” is in the plural. Paul is writing to a congregation, not to an individual. In fact, the entire discussion up to that point in Chapter 10 involves Paul referencing specific events that occurred in the wilderness during the Exodus from Egypt and the subsequent wanderings in which the Israelites disobeyed God.

In verse 14, Paul tells the congregation in Corinth, “therefore, my dear friends, flee from the worship of idols.” The testing referred in 1 Cor 10:13, the verse from which we get the proverb “God will not give you more than you can handle?” is the temptation of idolatry.

Where the ‘proverb’ makes it sound like God is one doing the testing, Paul does not see it that way. Rather, the testing that the community is undergoing is the result of the actions of people within the community. The testing that God will not allow the community to be tested beyond their strength is human caused, not divinely imposed. Paul is telling them God is faithful, and if you, the community of faith, put your communal trust in God and not in your individual self-interests, you will make it through this self-imposed crisis. The saying “God will not give you more than you can handle” may sound like Scripture, but it is not.

Following Christ is not and has never been an individual endeavor. It is and always has been a community endeavor. A community made up of people, but a community all the same. Yes, we do have a personal relationship with Christ Jesus our Lord and our relationship is one that is built up, sustained, and supported in community. It is a relationship lived out in communion with one another through the Holy Spirit in a community of faith.

We are to read Scripture together. We are to learn together. We are to work together. We are to pray together. Mourn together. Support one another in our trials and tribulations. Celebrate together. Rejoice together. Share what we have with one another. Hold each other accountable. Because when we do those things together trusting in God, we are able to get through trials and tribulations that we cannot get through alone.

Because you know that other saying “work out your own salvation with fear and trembling”? It is a direct, but partial, quote from Philippians 2:12. It is also in the plural. And what people leave off is the following verse: “for it is God who is at work in [all of you], enabling [all of you] both to will and to work for God’s good pleasure.” (Phil 2:12b-13). God does not intend for us to do any of this alone. That’s why, through the Holy Spirit, God is with us, and we are given the gift of community – and that is a really precious gift.



Children and Youth Ministry July 2025



Presbyterian Youth Triennium 2025



July 28 - July 31, 2025, the Presbyterian Church (USA) will welcome thousands of its high school age youth and their adult youth workers to Louisville, Kentucky for four days of worship, recreation, bible study, outreach, and faith formation all around the theme of “As If We Were Dreaming”. Most programming and meals will be held at the Kentucky International Convention Center (KICC) with all participants housed at nearby Triennium hotels.

The Presbyterian Youth Triennium (PYT) is an ecumenical event hosted by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and the Cumberland Presbyterian Church that gathers high school age young people every 3 years. It is a well-planned and thoughtfully led event focused on worship, disciple making, Christian compassion & justice and biblical/theological education. It is also a catalyst for many young people to take the next steps in their faith.







Session Summary

June 22, 2025

The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Hansen.

The agenda was approved.

The minutes of the May 18, 2025 stated Session meeting were approved as submitted.

The Treasurer's report, including Statement of Assets and Profit & Loss budget were reviewed and approved.

The Session approved the following actions:

To accept, with regrets, the resignation of Nancy Isaacs from Session.

Set a regular Session meeting on July 20, 2025 @ 6 p.m.

To join First Presbyterian Church of Emira for worship at their location @ 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, July 6, 2025 to kick off our joint VBS.

To allow the Communications & Technology committee to spend not more than \$200 to purchase 2 Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) units. When the power goes out, our servers shut off, which could cause our data to be corrupted, then they are difficult to reboot. UPS units will save our data, then turn off the servers, thus protecting them.

For NPC to host a dinner for the Matsiko Choir, followed by a performance on July 17, 2025. Reservations are required. Volunteers are needed to help with clean up.

For NPC to pay for admission for the Matsiko Choir to tour the Corning Museum of Glass (CMOG).

Pastor Hansen led a book discussion of chapters 2 & 3 of *Beyond the Offering Plate: A Holistic Approach to Stewardship*

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.
