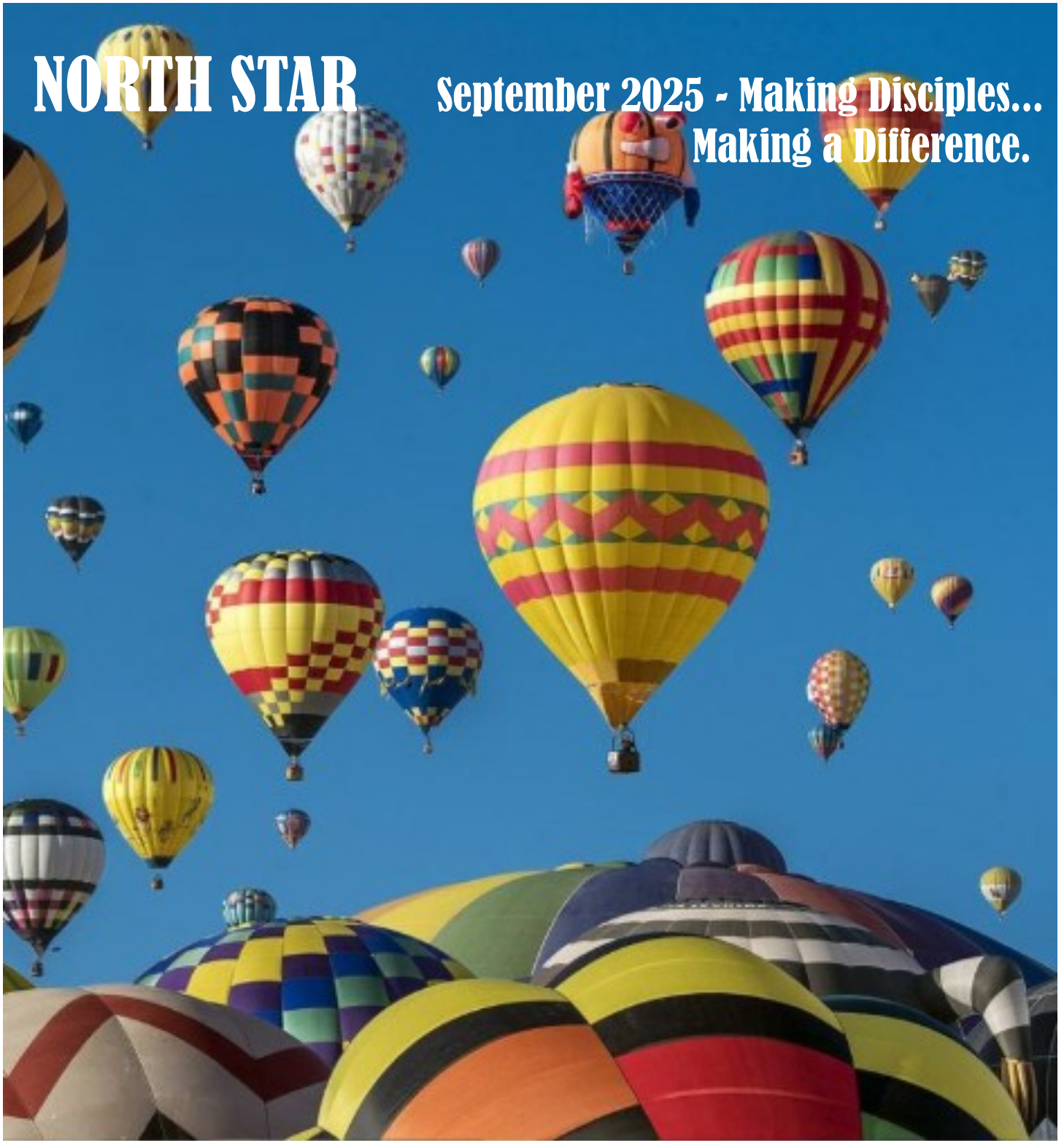

Prior to becoming a pastor, I think I went to the Adult Sunday School class at First Presbyterian Church of Pendleton, Oregon, once – and that was to give a presentation. But I did go to a weekly men's breakfast at a local restaurant, that liked to call itself "The Men's Tuesday Morning B.S. Group" which could stand for bible study or book study or something else entirely. I am not going to say that the books we studied were great (some of them were not) but what I came to really appreciate and the reason I kept going was the community I found in this weekly gathering. Yes, we gathered to learn about God, but in doing so we learned about each other and from each other.

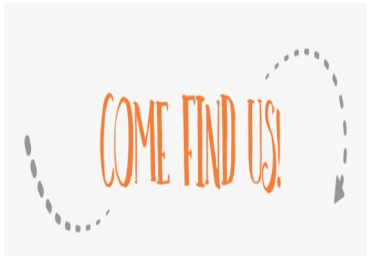
We live in a world in which there is a growing sense of isolation and loneliness. Depending on one's television, internet, and social media habits, we are, on the surface at least, connected in ways that boggle the mind. At the same time, as connected as we may seem, much of that connection is no longer in person. I am not saying that telephone calls, FaceTiming, video calls, and other forms of communication are a bad thing. They are not. In fact, they make life easier. It is wonderful to be able to talk to and video conference with people on the other side of the country. But there is also something about community formed in the week-in, week-out of in-person gatherings.

That group of men (and sometimes my daughter, Eliana, if I had to take her to school that day) would have had much different connections had we not met in-person in the back of a small restaurant around 6 a.m. or so every Tuesday morning. My understanding of the community Kate and I were living in, working in, and raising a family in would have been much more shallow and far less colorful. I would not have heard the stories of Mick, who started the local school bus company. I would not have heard the stories of Wes, who flew fighter jets in Vietnam, and who ended up running the local farmer's grain co-op. I would not have heard Hugh's stories, or Pete's stories, or Dale's. My life would have been much less rich, and my life would have been much more isolated. In the end, the men's group was more than a "book study," it was community. It was a form of church.

As we come into the fall, the men's bible study will meet Thursdays at noon and will study John Bunyan's "Pilgrim's Progress." The Wednesday noon bible study is starting a study titled "Never Beyond Hope." The Adult Sunday School class, which meets after worship in the fall and the spring, will be studying the Gospel of Mark this fall. I would be remiss in not mentioning Sunday School classes for pre-K through high school or other youth activities. These too are places where we find community. I hope you will consider joining us as we gather to learn about God and learn about each other and what it means to be in a community of faith.

Children and Youth Ministry September 2025

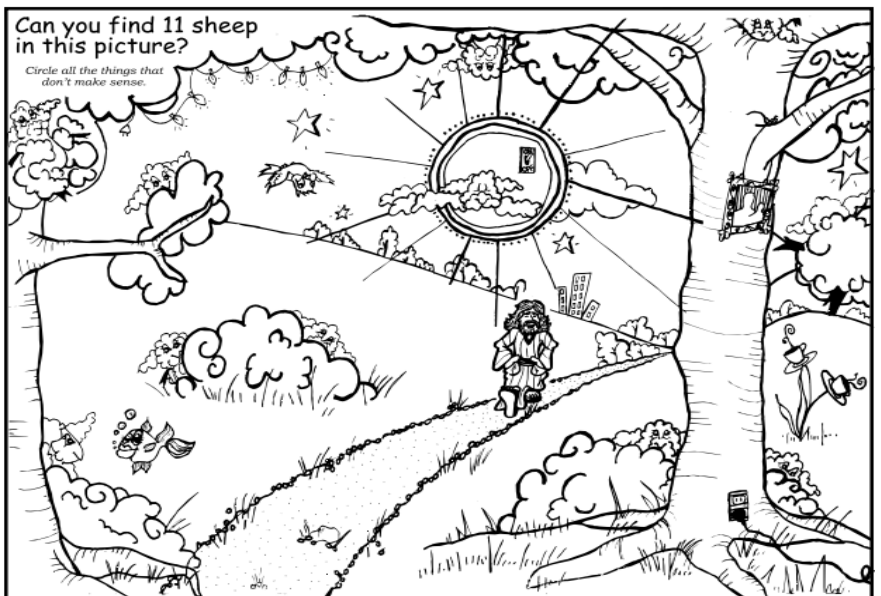
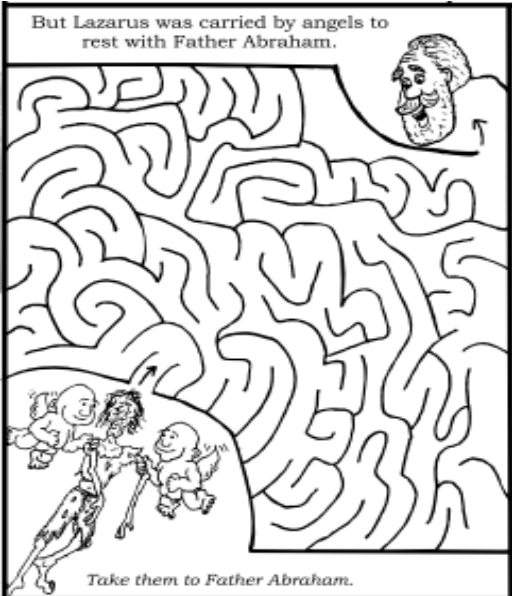

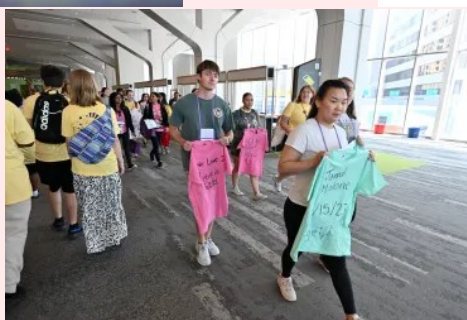

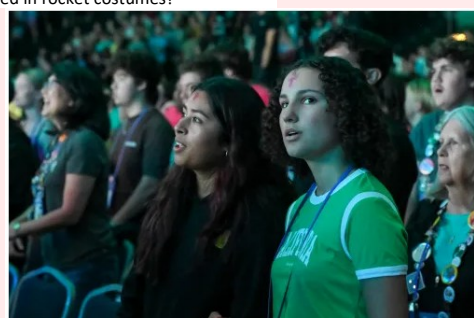

NPC Board of Session

Session Summary

August 17, 2025

The meeting was opened with scripture and prayer by Bill Furnas.

The agenda was approved as amended.

The minutes of the July 20, 2025 stated Session meeting were approved as submitted.

The Treasurer's report, including Statement of Assets and Profit & Loss budget were reviewed and approved.

The following correspondence was read:

A letter from Rev. Dr. Robert Edmunds

A thank you note from the PC(USA) Ministry Engagement & Support for our OGHS offering

Invitation from Habitat for Humanity to join in the Cities RISE event September 12 & 13, 2025

A thank you note from David Hansen for the Meyer Scholarship funds as well as our support of him over the last 5 years.

The Session approved the following actions:

The expenditure of no more than \$150 for the upcoming ice cream social after the August 31, 2025 joint service. The money will come from the Panosian Fund, which is designated for bringing the community together.

To split the loose cash offering from the August 31, 2025 joint worship service between the food pantries of NPC and First Presbyterian Church of Horseheads.

A follow up from the previous motion at the July 20, 2025 stated Session meeting, to confirm the date of October 12, 2025 for Renovation House to make a presentation during worship. Included in this motion was permission for a free will offering and sale of goods in the Narthex after worship to help support Renovation House.

For the Mission & Outreach Committee to set up a table in the Narthex to support CWS Blanket Sundays on November 2nd & November 9th of 2025.

Updated pamphlets were reviewed and revisions will be given to the church Admin for follow-up.

The purchase of a new computer, screen, keyboard and mouse to replace the Finance

computer. Purchase not to exceed \$400 and money will come from the custodial account.

The purchase of 2 monitors and a stand for the Office Admin computer. Purchase not to exceed \$300. Money to come from the custodial account.

To delay the purchase of the computer needed to run Songs Show Plus until their windows 11 update and we know exactly what is required to be compatible.

The purchase of a wireless transmitter (\$50) and a wall mount (\$100) to mount the TV behind the Welcome Center by Rally Day. Money to come from the custodial account.

The use of the sanctuary on Saturday, September 20, 2025 for a rotating contemporary Christian sing-a-long, which will be run by Lori Eastwood. The sing-a-long will not be broadcast via radio or zoom. We will assist with advertising to other churches, on the front sign, Facebook and other contacts.

To accept the proposal from Hale Roofing of \$2500 (from the Endowment) to cover the cost of repairing and replacing the flat roof over the Willets Hall wing.







The meeting was adjourned with prayer after thanking David Hansen for his service as Youth Elder and wishing him well as he goes off to college.
