In Jackson Browne's song, "The Late Show," from his 1974 album, *Late for the Sky*, Browne sings "Everyone I've ever known has wished me well[,] [a]nyway that's how it seems, it's hard to tell[.] Maybe people only ask you how you are doing 'cause that's easier than letting on how little they could care[.] But when you know that you've got a real friend somewhere[,] [s]uddenly all the others are so much easier to bear." At some point in my teens, my father introduced me to the music of Jackson Browne, and those lyrics have haunted me ever since.

In recent years, there has been more and more talk about a "loneliness epidemic" in our post-modern society and culture. Sometimes it is presented as if it is new. But as Jackson Browne so poignantly reminds us, the feelings of being alone and unseen and not cared about are nothing new.

I believe that part of the problem lies in what Jackson Browne identifies as the feeling that when people ask us how we are doing, they actually do not care. Perhaps you know the feeling I am talking about. The one that prompts many of us to answer the question, "How are you doing?" with "Fine." Even when we are anything but that.

If we go around trying to convince people that we are "fine" when we are anything but that, we are going to be lonely. We are going to spend our time and our lives cut off from each other because we are too afraid to be vulnerable. We are going to prevent people from being our friends.

Vulnerability is risky. It is also freeing. By now most of you know that my right ankle is quite painful right now. If I am unwilling to admit that my ankle hurts, I will go great lengths to pretend that I am doing just fine. However, that does not result in less pain, it results in more. I have a choice. I can go around afraid what people will think or I can say that "I am in pain" and take steps to take care of myself. One traps me and others in my lie, the other frees me to take care of myself and frees others to respond to what is going on with care and love.

As followers of Christ, we are called to love our neighbors by being neighbors. To borrow from Jackson Browne, we are called to be "real friends" which make "the others [...] so much easier to bear." We are called to be the people who ask, "How are you doing?" and mean it. And we cannot do this without being vulnerable to others.

It is when we are vulnerable that we often find that we have more in common with others than we realize. Just as we have health issues, so do they. Just as we have concerns about something going on in our lives, so do they. Just as we need to rest, so do they. As we trade stories and we listen to each other that we live into who our God created us to be – people in relationship with each other. People whose friendship makes all that we go through so much easier to bear. And what a gift from God that is.



We are hoping to plan some movie nights and sleepovers in this new year and that we can partner with First Pres. for some of the activities.






TRANSFORMING THE LIVES
OF MEN & WOMEN

Dear Friends and Partners of Renovation House,

As we come to the close of another year, our hearts are full of gratitude as we look back on all the ways God has moved within this ministry. Every restored life, every moment of breakthrough, every testimony of healing and hope has been possible because of your prayers, your support, and your belief that Christ still transforms lives. We truly could not do this without you.

This year has been one of both progress and restoration. Much of our focus has been on stewarding the campus God has entrusted to us, ensuring it remains a safe, functional, and peaceful place for men and women to encounter the Lord. We were grateful to install new roofing on two of our outbuildings, addressing issues that had been long overdue. While we are thankful for this progress, we were only able to complete partial repairs, and several roofs still require full replacement. These remaining projects are important to us as we continue creating dependable spaces for discipleship, counseling, and daily life.

One of our favorite additions this year was a new dock built on of our four ponds, offering residents a quiet place to pray, study Scripture, and meet with God. *“He leads us beside the still waters and restores our soul...”*

We also repaired and painted two parsonage buildings, restoring homes that serve the leaders and staff who pour into our residents each day. At the Men’s Home, we replaced the entire front wall and door after years of water damage had compromised its safety. Our aging rubber roof required more patchwork again this year as well.

One of the most spiritually meaningful developments this year has been the addition of our new pottery studio. The biblical picture of God as the potter and us as the clay has become a creative hands on experience for students, allowing them to feel in a tangible way what it means to be centered, shaped, and formed by the loving hands of the Lord. The Men’s Home woodshop also received functional upgrades; helping students develop skills and confidence that they can carry into their future.

Our therapy animals continue to grow, with two new miniature donkeys and three goats joining us this year. These animals can play a powerful role in the emotional healing of our residents. We hope to create a therapeutic animal space at the Women’s Home next year for the female students. We have also continued maintaining and expanding the walking trails throughout the

property; quiet paths where our students can experience some of their most meaningful moments with God. *“His word is a lamp unto our feet, and a light unto our path...”*

A particularly beautiful highlight this year was hosting one of our first weddings on the property; celebrating a former student who has built his life on Christ and is now stepping into a new season of joy and ministry as alumni. Moments like this remind us why this ministry matters so much.

As we look at this coming year, our desire is simple; to continue creating spaces, both physical and spiritual. Where broken lives can be rebuilt through the transforming power of Jesus Christ. From strengthening our discipleship programs, to improving staff housing and outdoor areas, finishing the necessary roof projects, adding another pond dock. We are praying and planning for growth that directly serves our student body; those who walk through our doors seeking help, hope and lasting change.

As the year comes to an end, we would like to gently invite you to consider Renovation House in your end-of-year giving. Your generosity helps us continue the work God has entrusted to us. By partnering with us, you join us in the effective work of rebuilding and restoring lives through the power of Jesus Christ who is the reason for this season.

Thank you for standing with us, for praying for us, and for helping create a place where the love of Christ rebuilds what was broken; and brings beauty from ashes. The kingdom of God continues to advance one life at a time, and God is still doing miracles on this mountain. We are deeply grateful for you, and we pray God’s richest blessings over you and your family this Christmas season and throughout the coming year.




