As a pastor, I often hear my colleagues talk about what we did not learn in seminary. Lawyers talk about what they never learned in law school. I imagine doctors do it as well. Sometimes for good reason. For example, in law school there are classes on business formation and business law, but no classes on how to run a business. There probably should be classes on running a law office, because some of the disciplinary cases I would read about every month in my bar association's magazine stemmed less from the lawyer not knowing the law than from not knowing how to run their office.

There are lots of things I did not learn in seminary. I did not learn about HVAC systems. I did not learn about code inspections and plowing services either. I did not learn how to "run" a church. Not that I run the church – the Session does. While I was at seminary, my seminary offered a class on church administration during a January term. I wanted to take it, but I had to take required worship class instead. As I recall, the course was cancelled due to lack of interest.

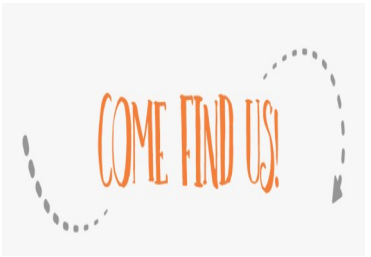
But the point of education, whether it is K-12, college, law school, seminary, medical school, or for that matter, Sunday school and church, is not to teach us everything we need to know. It is to teach us how to think and, in the context of seminary, Sunday school, and church, how to think theologically and how to listen to the Holy Spirit. We live in communities with real needs, in families that have ever-changing and complex family dynamics, in friendships that support us and sometimes disappoint us, and in bodies and lives that can be very messy. And to navigate that all, "pat" pre-formed, cookie-cutter answers almost never cut it.

One of the joys of being a Christian is that there are lots of things that I do not know and may never know. I do not have to have all the answers. This may sound strange but to me it is comforting. It means that God is not done with me or us. In the Presbyterian tradition, we talk about being "reformed and always reforming" and to me this means that we are always open to learning and to having our minds be changed. As much I love traditions, I also believe in a Holy Spirit that teaches us new things and upends our ideas of who God is and where God is taking us.

That the Holy Spirit continues to teach us and upend our ideas is an act of grace. It is what helps us to adapt to changing times and changing neighborhoods and changing needs. It is what helps us make course corrections when we realize that "this is how we have always done it" is no longer going to cut it. This is the Spirit who teaches us to love the person in front of us. And to love the person in front of us, we have to love the person in front of us more than our assumptions about them and what we think we already know about them – because after all – we would want them to do the same for us.

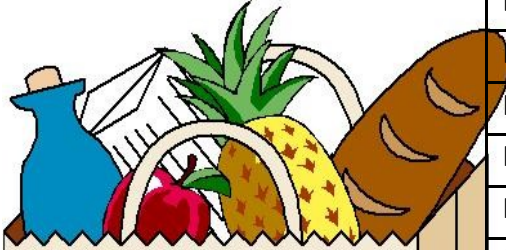

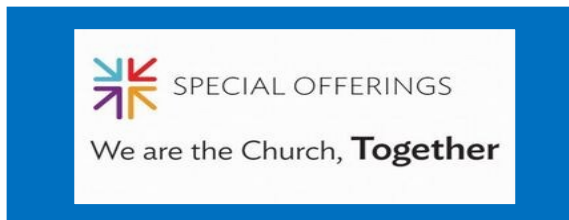

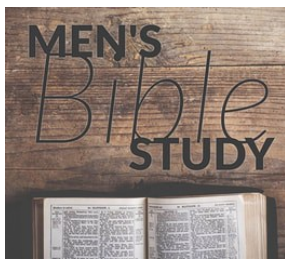

Regarding Ruling Elders: A Monthly Series for Serving Faithfully

REGARDING

RULING ELDERS



A MONTHLY RESOURCE FOR SERVING FAITHFULLY

Sam, after worship one Sunday: Pastor, I read something in the presbytery's newsletter that mentioned a gathering for people in ordered ministries. At first, I thought, "Does the presbytery order people into ministry?" Can you explain this term?

Pastor: Sam, let's get our coffee and sit down to talk.

In the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), ordered ministries refers to those offices in the church into which people are ordained and set apart to provide ordered leadership and service, "so that the ministry of the whole people of God may flourish" (Book of Order, G-2.0102). "The Church's ordered ministries described in the New Testament and maintained by this church are deacons and presbyters (ministers of the Word and Sacrament and ruling elders)" (G-2.0102).

People who are elected to these ordered ministries are ordained. "In ordination the church sets apart with prayer and the laying on of hands those who have been called by God through the voice of the church to serve as deacons, ruling elders, and ministers of the Word and Sacrament" (W-4.0401). Ordination is an act of a council of the church, such as a presbytery or session. The constitutional questions found in W-4.0404 are asked and answered at ordination and each time a person is installed for a new term of service, but the laying on of hands takes place only at ordination, once for each office (W-4.0403). The constitutional questions asked at ordination and installation are the same for all ordered ministries, except for the last question, which is specifically about the duties of the particular ministry.

We believe that people are called to these ministries. The call has three components: an individual's sense that the Holy Spirit is moving him or her to such service; "the approval of a community of God's people" (such as election by a congregation); "and the concurring judgment of a council of the Church" (G-2.0103).

For ruling elders and deacons, after election by the congregation, the session provides a "period of study and preparation, after which the session shall examine them as to their personal faith; knowledge of the doctrine, government, and discipline contained in the Constitution of the church; and the duties of the ministry" (G-2.0402). That may seem daunting, but many sessions conduct these examinations in a spirit of collegiality. When the examination is approved, then the candidate (s) are ordained and/or installed.

The process is lengthier for those seeking ordination as a teaching elder (minister of the Word and Sacrament) and usually includes achieving a seminary education, passing standard ordination exams and supervision of the presbytery of membership.

"Ministers of the Word and Sacrament (also called teaching elders and pastors) shall in all things be committed to teaching the faith in word and deed and equipping the saints for the work of ministry (Eph. 4:12). They may serve in a variety of ministries," and are under the oversight of the presbytery of which they are a member" (G-2.0501).



Ruling elders are people “with particular gifts to share in discernment of God’s Spirit and governance of God’s people.” Ruling elders are initially elected to serve on the session of their congregation. “Ruling” does not mean that these elders wield a crown and scepter but rather a measuring tape, as the session measures the spiritual health and growth and seeks to “strengthen and nurture [the] faith and life” of the congregation entrusted to its care (G-2.0301). Ruling elders may also participate in the life of the larger church as commissioners to other councils. Some are called and prepared to serve in limited pastoral service (G-2.1001).

“The ministry of **deacon** as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ ...” (G-2.0201). The session maintains oversight of the deacons, who may be individuals commissioned to specific work or may be organized as a board. Not all congregations choose to have the ordered ministry of deacon but the function of this ministry is always preserved and falls to the ruling elders and the session (G-2.0202).

Deacons and ruling elders are elected for terms, usually three years, and may not serve an aggregate of terms equaling more than six years, unless an exemption has been granted by the presbytery upon request of the congregation (G-2.0404).

Ordinarily, when one enters an ordered ministry, it is for life, though not always in active service. If you have been ordained as a deacon or ruling elder, you are *always* one, though you may not currently be serving on the respective board, although there are provisions for leaving or being removed from ordered ministry. Whether in active service or not, ruling elders may be elected to serve as commissioners and may be elected by the more inclusive councils to serve on committees, commissions or as officers, and as such, “ruling elders participate and vote with the same authority as teaching elders, and they are eligible for any office” (G-2.0401).

For Reflection:

- How have you experienced a sense of call to serve in the ministry of ruling elder?
- What decisions/oversight reflect the session’s duty to measure the health of the congregation and “strengthen and nurture [its] faith and life?”
- In what ways have you seen the work of deacons as a ministry of “compassion, witness and service” in your congregation?

Alyson Janke is a sixth-generation Presbyterian. A ruling elder, she has served as the Stated Clerk in John Knox Presbytery for 31 years and been commissioned to limited pastoral service at Wild Rose Presbyterian Church in Winnebago Presbytery for 25 years. She served on the PC(USA) Advisory Committee on the Constitution and taught Presbyterian Polity at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary. She and her husband have retired from dairy farming.





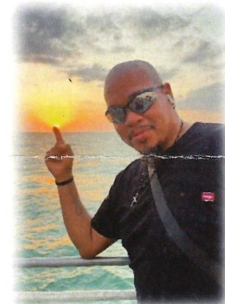
Hello Renovation House Family,

He wanted my undivided yes and he would take care of the rest. Heavy rain & winds hit Alabama and destroyed the tent I was living in. Blankets pillows everything was destroyed. That night as I lay covered in cardboard boxes to protect myself from the wind, wet & cold, I thought to myself man I am doing the right things here why was God punishing me so much. I didn't understand. I wanted the Lord to take my life in my despair. Before I went to bed that night I said a simple prayer. Lord God, I don't understand everything you are doing, but I trust you. I gave Him my yes hoping he would provide the rest.



The next day I got a call from a friend back in NY saying The Lord put on their heart to pay all my expenses to come back to NY and go to Renovation House. The funny thing about this is my mother offered me to go there before I went to Alabama, but I thought for sure it was not the place for me. In my pride I thought I knew better, boy was I so wrong. It turned out it was exactly where I needed to go. God humbled me in so many ways preparing me to go.



I thank God for Reverend Earley and Renovation House ministry, for making a place where men and woman can have an opportunity to be discipled and pursue a deeper relationship with a loving God. My God is a skillful surgeon cutting out all the real reasons I had turned

to drugs, one cut at a time and letting me heal in between. I didn't realize how much trauma I had buried. Renovation House provides the space and opportunity to do this critical work, experiencing The Lords rest for a time. Staff empowered with guidance from the Holy Spirit hold the chaos of the whole world at bay. This provided a program tailor fit for me by the Holy Spirit to learn to hear my Fathers voice clearer than ever before.

Like Jesus said in John 10:27-28

27 My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:

28 And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand.

As a student of Renovation House, I have learned to be still, abide in the presence of God and learn to hear his still small voice.

This program is a year. Some might complain it's too long. But I love the parable from the Bible that Reverand Earley shares with all students about the Gardner that interceded for a fig tree that produced no fruit. Give me a year with it he said... (Luke 13:6-9).

I was that fig tree, producing no fruit and the world saying throw him away, he has no use. God (through Renovation House) has been my Gardner. Helping me understand my purpose and Gods plan for my life. I gave God a year at Renovation House. I graduated November 2025 and became an Alumni. I now serve as an Intern in this great ministry getting to be a part of other people's journey as they too experience the mighty saving power of Jesus Christ, the 4th man in the fire. I get to serve Gods children and share the same message of hope God gave me.

"Give me your yes and I will provide the rest."

Thank you for giving to the Renovation House, without your generosity we wouldn't be here. You are truly saving lives. My family, kids and grandchildren thank you because one of those lives was mine
